

VOLUNTEERS


Dedicated volunteers are the driving force behind many of our programs and services. In 2018, 1,300 volunteers donated an incredible 16,094 hours of service. Our 144 volunteers at Naval Medical Center San Diego cuddled babies in the NICU; taught our Wounded, Injured, and III how to surf or how to turn a block of wood into a work of art in our woodturning program; and brightened the days of patients and their families with their visits and therapy dogs; and supported many other activities as well. Over 330 active duty service members in our Military Volunteer Program supported Armed Services YMCA San Diego events as well as fed the homeless at Father Joe's Villages; sorted food at Feeding San Diego; and distributed technology to families in need with Computers 2 San Diego Kids. Armed Services YMCA San Diego is proud to have had 30 different corporate or community groups in 2018 that provided enthusiastic volunteers to our events.




