RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Response Team response with 15-20 minutes to report to scene for local Law Enforcement Calls; 30 minutes for outof-area response, ie. Juvenile Hall.
- Conduct safety assessments and provide crisis intervention services.
- > Transportation of clients to safety placement location, as needed.
- Complete CWS referrals when appropriate.
- Maintain the Response Team bags contents including any Response Team packets.
- Check and maintain condition of on-call phone and/or laptop.
- Attend team, agency and other meetings as requested by Program Director, including the Response Team night meeting twice monthly.
- > Complete case file paperwork completely and in a timely manner.
- > Enter client level data and case note into database same day as call.
- > Other duties as assigned by Program Director and/or Department Director.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Minimum 1 - 2 years experience in child, youth and family services field. Experience should preferably have been in a community based or neighborhood service organization. Experience in the areas of domestic violence, individual, group, and family counseling, community education and development, advocacy and case management. Ability to work with a diverse cultural population. B.A. or B.S. degree, (M.A. or M.S.W. strongly preferred) in social work, psychology or related field, experience may be substituted. Bilingual (English/Spanish or English/Tagalog) strongly preferred

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

Stand: Remaining on one's feet in an upright position.

Walking: Moving about on foot.

Lifting: Raising or lowering an object from one level to another (includes upward pulling) 25-50 lbs

Carrying: Transporting an object, usually holding it in the hands or arms, or on the shoulder

Pushing: Exerting force upon an object so that the object moves away from the force.

Pulling: Exerting force upon an object so that the object moves toward the force (includes jerking)

Climbing: Ascending or descending stairs, using feet and legs or hands and arms. Body agility is emphasized

Balancing: Maintaining body equilibrium to prevent falling when walking, standing, crouching.

Stooping: Bending body downward and forward by bending spine at the waist, requiring full use of the lower extremities and back muscles.

Handling: Seizing, holding, grasping, turning, or otherwise working with hand or hands. Fingers are involved only to the extent that they are an extension of the hand.

Finger Movement: Picking, pinching, or otherwise working primarily with fingers rather than with the whole hand or arm as in handling

Talking: Expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word. Talking is important for those activities in which workers must impart oral information to clients or to the public, and in those activities in which they must convey detailed or important spoken instructions to other workers accurately, loudly, or quickly.
