Responsibilities:

- The Medical Director will develop, designs, implements, oversees, and sustains a program of medical direction for Emergency Medical Technicians at the Basic, AEMT, and Paramedic level, in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and industry best practices.
- The Medical Director will develop, designs, and implements a system of quality assurance and skill competency for those technicians under his medical direction.
- The Medical Director will develops and maintain a set of clinical protocols followed by the technicians under his medical direction that conform to the relevant scope of practice as defined by the National Emergency Medical Services Scope of Practice.
- The Medical Director will develop, designs, implements, and sustains a system of continuing medical education that meets required recertification requirements, is responsive to identified quality assurance issues, and maintains the cognitive knowledge base necessary to perform to protocol and industry standard.
- Able to deploy on a short notice for short 30-60 days in country for monitoring companionless, creating SOPS and working with the Client.

Requirements:
