- Designs and implements teen led initiatives to support programs of JFS including, but not limited to: conducting food drives, coordinating agency volunteers, coordinating fundraisers, giving educational and outreach presentations, and socials.
- Assists with hunger advocacy initiatives including coordination of Hunger Action Day.
- Engages in community outreach activities.
- Develops curriculum focused around alleviating hunger, building teen self-confidence, identity issues, women's issues, privilege, oppression, inclusion, and more.
- Supervises teen-led service projects and/or volunteer opportunities.
- Leads monthly leadership meetings, teen retreats and other events as necessary.
- Plans and implements large fundraising event.
- Adheres to program budgets.
- Collaborates and coordinates with both teen leadership programs and implements joint program activities where appropriate.
- Maintains regular parent correspondence / holds parent education workshops.
- Mentors youth, tracks volunteer hours, provides written letter of recommendations to teen participants.
- Manages facilitation of program fees.
