# Did you know? TBI Data

There are 4 different qualifications of TBI:


- Concussion/Mild TBI
- Moderate TBI (Last more than 24 hrs)
- Severe TBI (last >24 hrs, less than 7 days)
- Penetrating TBI or open head injury

## How is TBI Treated?

If your brain has been injured, you may need treatment and rehabilitation. This might include:

- Physical and Occupational Therapy
- Speech and language therapy
- Counseling
- Social support and support groups
- Medicines




