


Did You know?

Facts and Numbers

The average U.S. family with at least one child under 5 years old must spend 13 percent of its income on child care, the U.S. Treasury Department estimated in a 2021 report.

The income limits to qualify for subsidized childcare are so low that most young children can't access it. Only about 37 percent of California children under 4 years old met the criteria to get it in 2020, according to an analysis of the latest estimates available from the American Institutes for Research Early Learning Needs Assessment Tool.
